The labor movement is down to 6.9% of the private sector workforce.



The law is stacked against workers who want to organize into unions.

In 2009, the Employee Free Choice Act, which would have strengthened workers right to organize, passed the House of Representatives and had 55 votes out of 100 in favor of passage in the U.S. Senate.

But the EFCA never came to a vote on the floor. The Senate's antiquated and undemocratic filibuster rules allow just 41 Senators to prevent a bill from being voted on.

As the new Congress convenes, the Democrats have the power to change the Senate rules to make it much harder to filibuster pro-worker legislation.
